

Notice Of Western Canada Region Soroptimist Society Annual General Meeting

Conference Rules

1. The Voting Delegates of the Region shall be the Western Canada Region Board and three (3) accredited Delegates of each Western Canada Region Club in good standing.
2. A Club shall be deemed to be in good standing upon meeting all requirements of Federation, Region and Club By-Laws by the time of the Delegates' registration.

Standing Rules

1. All Voting Delegates must wear their official badge at business sessions.
2. All Voting Delegates must be seated together by club at the front of the Conference Room promptly at the beginning of each session.
3. The Agenda as adopted shall be the Order of the Day.
4. Ringers on cell phones shall not be allowed during business sessions and workshops.
5. Only registered Voting Delegates shall answer the roll call or vote.
6. Upon rising to address the Chair, each Delegate shall state their name and the name of their club.
7. A registered alternate may only replace a Delegate for serious reasons and after withdrawal of the registered Delegate has been received and approved by the Credentials Committee.
8. During a debate, a member may speak for two (2) minutes and once only, unless no one else wishes to speak.
9. All non-routine motions shall be submitted in writing to the Board Secretary on approved forms at the time they are made.
10. Where inconsistent with the Soroptimist laws, Robert's Rules of Order shall govern.

By Air

By Ferry

Arriving a bit early? join us for a bus tour showcase of the past and future of Soroptimist in Canada!





Proposed Bylaw Amendments

The following three items are proposed amendments to the Region’s existing Bylaws. Each amendment will be voted on individually during the Friday, April 24, 2026 business sessions.

Proposed Bylaw Change #1

The current Region Bylaws will be edited to include the removal of gendered pronouns as well as grammatical changes to improve the flow of language to the extent that these changes do not alter the intent of the wording of the Bylaws.

Proposed Bylaw Change #2

ARTICLE VIII

Committees

Proposed Change

8.1 Standing Committees

The Region shall have standing committees as determined by the Region or SIA, and as listed in the Region Procedures.

Rationale:

In 2016, section 8.1 was removed from the Region Bylaws which is not standard procedure. The section should have been left in place and “repealed” added to indicate that it had been intentionally removed. This section will now be included with the proposed wording which has been approved by SIA Headquarters.

Proposed Bylaw Change #3

ARTICLE IX

Finance

Proposed Change

Section 9.9 *If the projected ~~income~~ expenses increase ~~changes~~ by more than ~~\$2,000.00~~ \$5,000.00 for the biennium the Treasurer shall prepare a revised budget to be approved by the Board and the voting delegates at Conference in the odd number year as well.*



Rationale:

The Board feels that changes to the budget that should require approval from the voting delegates should be increased to expenses rather than changes to income. The Board does not feel that the voting delegates would be concerned if there was a budget change that resulted in a surplus, but a budget change that resulted in a significant increase to expenses may be a cause for concern and should require review. The amount of an increase in expenses has been updated to \$5,000 to reflect changing economic times. This wording has been reviewed and supported by SIA Headquarters.

Proposed Changes To Region Operating Procedures

The following revisions will be made to the Operating Procedures of Western Canada Region.

NOTE - Where new wording is being proposed in the Operating Procedures, it appears in red.

OP-VIII Committees

Standing Committees – See Bylaws

- ~~● The Chairperson of the Program Committee is the Region representative on the Federation Program Council.~~

The Region shall have the following standing committees as directed by SIA:

- o Membership (Engagement)
- o Fundraising (Philanthropy)
- o Program (Impact)
- o Public Awareness (Recognition), and
- o Education

Duties of Committee Chairs

Membership (Engagement) Chair

- is appointed by the Governor
- has duties as described in the current Region Membership Chair Position Description provided by SIA.



Fundraising (Philanthropy) Chair

- is appointed by the Governor
- has duties as described in the current Region Fundraising Chair Position Description provided by SIA

Program (Impact) Chair

- is appointed by the Governor
- has duties as described in the current Region Program Chair Position Description provided by SIA

Public Awareness (Recognition) Chair

- is appointed by the Governor
- has duties as described in the current Region Public Awareness Chair Position Description provided by SIA

Education Chair

- is appointed by the Governor
- has duties as described in the current Education Chair Position Description provided by SIA

In addition to the Membership, Fundraising, Program and Public Awareness Committees which exist and are directed by SIA, the Region shall have the following standing committees and appointments:

1. Conference Committee

1. Memorial Book Committee

- ~~A Memorial Book recording the deaths of Soroptimists in the Region shall be maintained.~~
- ~~Committee Chairperson is responsible for ensuring the book is taken to Conference each year.~~
- ~~Committee Chairperson is responsible for ensuring the names are entered into the book before the Memorial Service, which is held during opening ceremonies.~~

RATIONALE: *The Memorial Book Committee has not existed for several years. This duty seems obsolete in the present day. There is a need to ensure the information in the Memorial Book is not lost and should be included in the Region Google drive and perhaps on the WCR website.*

A Conference Committee shall be appointed by the Governor and shall consist of:



- Conference Chair
- Venue Chair
- Registration Chair
- Credentials Chair
- Memorial Chair
- Hospitality Chair
- Technology
- Transportation and Logistics
- And any other positions as deemed necessary

The duties and responsibilities of the Conference Committee members shall be as specified in the Conference Handbook as amended from time to time.

6. Celebrating Success Chair

- is appointed by the Governor
- solicits applications for the WCR Celebrating Success Awards, which recognize projects & practices that improve the lives of women and girls.
- arranges for up to 3 independent judges to judge the award applications
- arranges for the purchase and distribution of the awards, the winners of which will be announced at Conference

Standing Committee expenses shall be paid to the extent provided for in the budget.

Special committees

In addition to the listed standing committees, the Governor may strike an additional special committee or task force as needed.

OP-IX Finance

Governor

- Each quadrennium, funds shall be budgeted for the Governor or her alternate to attend the ~~International Board Meeting~~ **International Convention**. The amount designated may not pay all of the delegate's expenses.
- ~~Funds shall be designated for Governor's Round Table. In a non-convention year, the amount designated may not pay all of the Governor's expenses.~~

RATIONALE: *The Governor's Round Table does not exist anymore. It has been replaced with an online Leadership Round Table, which does not require funds for travel. For clarity, "International Board Meeting" has been replaced with "International Convention."*

Growth and Development

- The Growth and Development Fund shall be capped at \$10,000.00 each biennium. At the end of each biennium, all ~~dollars money~~ in excess of \$10, 000.00 shall be transferred to the General **Operating Account Reserve**.



- Clubs may request ~~\$300.00~~ **\$500.00** to investigate the development of a new club. Proof of expenditures must be submitted to the Region Treasurer by June 30th of the year in which the funds are disbursed.
- Clubs may request a further ~~\$300.00~~ **\$500.00** towards the chartering of the new club.
- Members of the Board and the Membership Committee will be reimbursed, to the extent provided for in the budget, for expenses incurred in travelling to help a club increase membership.

NOTE: *There is currently NO amount provided for travel expenses incurred by the membership committee for this. This needs to be addressed in the 2026-2028 budget after a review of amounts spent this biennium.*

- ~~Under exceptional circumstances;~~ **At the discretion of the board,** clubs with 13-19 members may **apply for a Growth and Development Grant. The amount will be no more than \$500.00 per**

biennium. ~~apply for a grant for no more than \$500.00 (per biennium) at the discretion of the Board.~~

- ~~Funding of programs that will promote the leadership and growth in the Region.~~

RATIONALE: *This statement did not make sense as it is written.*

Region Awards & Programs

2. Frances E. Wagner Soroptimist Woman of Achievement Award

- This ~~award~~ **certificate** shall be ~~engraved~~ **inscribed** with the name of the honoree and shall remain in her possession **along with a commemorative pin.**

3. **Celebrating Success**

- **These awards are presented annually.**
- **Clubs will submit entries for the awards as described in the designated categories, which honour outstanding/creative/effective programs or practices undertaken from January 1 to December 31 of the prior year (i.e. the year prior to the current conference).**
